

PASTOR JON'S COLUMN — The Good Samaritan

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

"What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?"

He answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'.

"You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live." But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two

denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"

The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise." Luke 10:25-27

If you actually read my newsletter articles you may notice that sometimes I write about a text that we have heard during a recent worship. I was planning to move away from that this month, but the Samaritan story has continued to haunt my mind over the last week. I, like many of you have heard this story many times. "Good Samari-

tan" is a phrase that is part of our language. It is burrowing into my very being - that is - two thoughts that I cannot let go of!

First of all, what struck me about this familiar story is not that it was the Samaritan who helped the Jew but rather the extent to which the Samaritan helped him. Our Samaritan *extraordinaire*, was not only willing to pull over, see what had really happened, and then engage. He went well beyond that. He took his charge to a nearby inn and gave the innkeeper what amounted to a blank check to do whatever made sense. "The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend'" (v. 35). Mr. Samaritan could have ended his involvement there but committed to returning after fulfilling another commitment.

The second thought about this parable may possibly come from what I believe the Lawyer may have been thinking. "I cannot possibly do this!" If he was thinking something along those lines, as I have on many occasions in ministry (can I get an AMEN!?) well – he was right. We cannot possibly show *that* kind of love ... We cannot possibly show that kind of love apart from our relationship with God!

This Samaritan was a person who knew the blessing of grounding one's life in faithful loving kindness to God and others. The lawyer whose original question prompted Jesus



to tell this story could not have missed this. The issue for our lawyer was not to understand the limit of his responsibility but rather the extent of his opportunity – opportunity to really love and be loved – rooted in this One who stood before him – Jesus the Christ.

So too, it is for us. We cannot do anything, any of this *love thing*, without the Spirit of the Living God within us – prayer, study, communion with others in faith – It just does not happen automatically! It is funny (and sad) to me that this outsider, this Samaritan, seems to know this when often I do not!

So I am asking myself (and ask you to ask yourself): Where do my gifts, vocation, and avocation create opportunities to bless the lives of others with the steadfast lovingkindness of the gospel of the kingdom of God? Where does my church's time, talent, and treasure offer corporate opportunities for the same? Where these answers lead is where we can validate God's steadfast love to us by extending it to others!

As a result of the Supreme Court action concerning same-sex marriage and to avoid successful lawsuits to both the congregation and to the pastor we are in need of updating our constitution and bylaw language, to reflect a scriptural understanding on marriage.

We are aware that personal opinions on this matter may vary within the Trinity Community. Please know that the additions put forth will provide protection in the event of legal actions that could or may be taken against Trinity Lutheran

Church and/or Trinity Lutheran Church's Pastor. The additions recommended will help clarify and ensure cohesion between Trinity Lutheran Church and Church Leadership, and Trinity Lutheran Church and its relationship within the community it serves.

The additions to our Constitution and Bylaws reflect much work and effort on the part of the participants, utilizing language already adopted by many sister LCMC congregations under the guidance of legal aid attorneys. The Special Congregation Meeting will be held September 18, 2016.


- 🖎 One pencil sharpener
