PASTOR JON'S COLUMN - *The Radical Hospitality of Jesus - "Come and See"*

³⁵ The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. ³⁶ When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!" ³⁷ When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. ³⁸ Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, "What do you want?" They said, "Rabbi" (which means "Teacher"), "where are you staying?" ³⁹ "Come," he replied, "and you will see."

John 1:35-39a

Imagine this scenario – you have been very busy. Several visitors have just left your home leaving you with lots of clearing and clean-up to do – There is hardly anything in the fridge or the cupboards, and you are tired. You decide that today you are going to rest. Tomorrow you will go shopping and do the housework – not today. So you make yourself comfortable and settle down to watch the Packer game.

An hour later you are the doorbell rings. You – to say the least, are disturbed. You open the door to find yourself met by huge smiles. Dear friends have dropped in for a surprise visit; they have brought their teenage children with them.

How do you respond? How do you feel? How are you going to offer them the hospitality they are seeking? Are you able to say come in, take me as I am? I guess it may depend on the type of person you are, but I suspect that none of us would turn them away. The challenge they are presenting us with is not one of inconvenience, but rather one of hospitality and how we might offer it

I was recently reminded of an encounter I had many years ago at my first church. Like Trinity, the church hosted Alcoholic Anonymous meetings. On that night I had attended and, with the meeting over, went into the parking lot where I noticed a man standing alone near a rusty car. I introduced myself. As we talked, he learned I was the pastor there as well. He sighed and told me how long he had intended to

"get back to church." I invited him to worship.

With that he began to tell me the story of his life. It was a familiar string of regrets and loss that accompany addiction. We shared a bit more with each other and said, "Good night."

As I was walking to my car, he called out to me, "Did you mean what you said?"

"About what?" I asked.

"Did you mean that I could come to this church?"

You know, only in the last couple of years has it dawned on me that he had told me his life's story *as a response to my invitation. From the experience of many other encounters since then, I have come to believe that the telling of his story was a polite way of explaining why he couldn't take me up on my offer. He felt he wasn't "clean enough" to be included in our congregation. I never saw him again. I wish my response to his questions had been more direct. I wish I had simply repeated the words of*

Christ. I wish I had said, "Come and see."

"Come in, take me as I am." If we might struggle to extend such a welcome to our friends or family who drop by for a surprise visit, how might we welcome people into the church? Can we respond with Jesus words to those who followed him ... "Come and see?"

Jesus' call to follow him, to "come and see," turned out to be a characteristic of his ministry as he welcomed prostitutes and tax collectors, touched lepers and even dead bodies – the kindness of Jesus was controversial. He demonstrated disdain towards the secular and religious limits of social propriety for his hospitality knew no limit. It was not just indiscriminate: it was wide open kindness. He received Pharisees and sinners alike.

His welcome was gracious. He shared words

and relationship – he had nothing else to give as fancy meals were provided by others, and yet somehow Jesus was the host bringing the love of God to the conversation – surrounding his hearers in grace, giving and receiving at the same time.

Come and see Jesus invitation is central to life in Him. Through his generous, almost promiscuous hospitality, Jesus reenacts the gracious presence of the Triune God. We live not in a world of divisions ruled over by a supreme being, but in a universe tightly bound and called into being by the God who desires intimacy with us. Divine hospitality lies at the heart of creation. It is also the source of our redemption. For we are invited to join the eternal dance – a dance that knows no limits as more and more people are welcomed to join, to catch the heartbeat rhythm of life ... Come and see

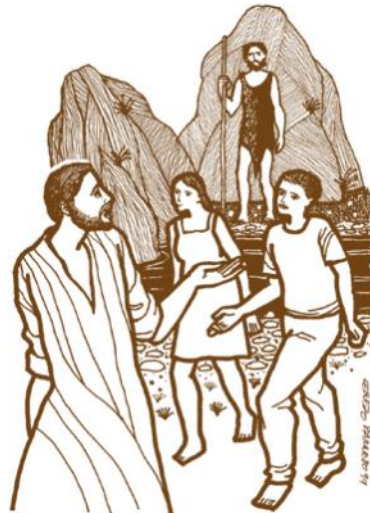
We do not need to hide behind masks of social niceties, or laden tables. Jesus challenge to us is to open our hearts to him and to others, to respond to his invitation, Come and see, and then, in turn to extend that invitation.

We live in a world where suspicion of everything is prevalent, even in the quiet township of the Birchwood area ... The Church by contrast is trying to create an open door, inviting the young, the old, the broken, the poor, the lifelong member and the newest seeker and recognizing them as valuable. Our invitation is simple; **Come and see**

Come and see ... you are welcome, come and see By issuing the invitation we create an open door, extend a welcome and provide the possibility of a new relationship, one where we may find ourselves changed by the God who meets us in unexpected people, and finds us in unexpected places. After all, if we ourselves are going to issue the invitation to someone – maybe we need to clarify for ourselves just who it is we are inviting them to "come and see."

So I offer the invitation to you this day. "Come and see"...

FELLOWSHIP & GROWTH CHAIRPERSON ASKS FOR EVENT CO-ORDINATORS

First, a little background on the council position for Fellowship & Growth. Ten years ago this was a new position on church council. Since then, Sue Svitak and Joanne Schilling have each served two-year terms, and I (Dianne Buxton) am on my sixth year as chairperson. Last year we held nine events, and over 120 people volunteered to help with those events.

This is an important committee, because it brings people together and lets people have fun together. The intent of an event is not necessarily to raise money, although a benefit for someone or something may fall into that category. Most of the time we try to break even with expenses, which makes our church treasurer very happy.

Fellowship & Growth is really, at minimum, a two-person committee, because a lot of hours are required. One person is not enough, so I'm seeking help from our congregation members. On the Welcome



Center in the narthex, is a red binder which is identified as "Fellowship & Growth Activities and Guidelines." Please take a look at it and see if there are any events you would consider chairing or co-chairing. I am stepping back from being chairperson and instead becoming a coach.

It should work like this: About 6-10 weeks before an event occurs, that event, guidelines for chairing it, and a sign-up sheet for whomever is willing to chair or co-chair it, will be in that red binder. I am willing to help with any publicity, announcements, etc., but the planning and effort needed to make that event a success will depend on the chair and/or co-chairs. I, like so many other congregational members, am willing to volunteer to make any event a success. This way, more people will be involved and be contributing. If no one volunteers as a chair or co-chair, that event will not be held.

The first event in 2016 is the Fifth Sunday Potluck on

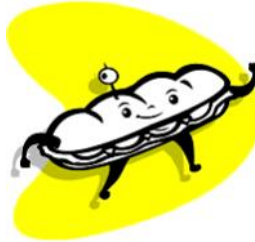

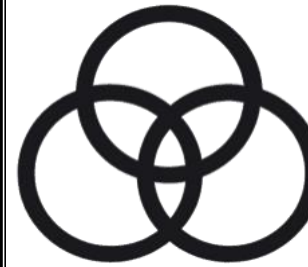
