If you are interested in being nominated, please contact the church office at 715-354-3790. Below is a brief job description of the positions that need to be filled.

VICE PRESIDENT: Serve as vice-chair of the Congregation Council and act on behalf of the chair when the President is unable to attend or participate; and provide leadership and serve as a resource to Ministry Teams.

TREASURER:

Oversee all financial matters, and ensure that acceptable accounting methods are used in keeping all books of account;

Advise the Congregation Council of financial status and implications of short and long-term decisions;

Submit written reports to all Congregation Council and Congregation meetings; and Shall prepare the proposed budget for the ensuing year.

Approve and sign all checks issued.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY:

Be charged with the responsibility for counting the offering after every service at which an offering is taken.

Oversee and record the receipts of offering and other gifts; and

Be responsible for putting together and distributing biannual statements of members' giving.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE: Shall have responsibility for recruiting, training and sending out members to assist the pastor with pastoral care of congregation members; may include visiting persons who are hospitalized, homebound or in nursing homes; shall see to the recording and delivery of audio recordings of worship services, offering grief support and other kind of assistance to persons in need.

EDUCATION, YOUTH & FAMILY: Shall have charge of education and faith activities of this congregation, including Sunday School, Vacation Bible School (VBS), youth activities, and adult education.

EVANGELISM: Shall direct efforts at reaching out to persons outside this community of faith; shall create and distribute publicity regarding church activities; shall provide information to worship guests and organize follow-up visits to such guests and other persons interested in the life and ministry of this congregation.

WORSHIP & MUSIC: shall have special responsibility for matters pertaining to this congregation's worship life; shall recruit and nominate a Minister of Music, choir director (s), and organist(s); shall recruit, train and schedule ushers, greeters, communion servers, and other worship assistants.

- There are two new wooden kitchen stools in the kitchen which the Women of Trinity have donated.
- Lefse making will be November 15, starting at 9:00 a.m. No experience needed, and it's a really good time. Lefse will be sold on November 18th, the week of Thanksgiving, and also during the Bake Sale on Sunday, December 2^{nd.}
- A motion was made and passed to donate money toward the new Bibles confirmation students receive while studying to be confirmed. We used to give Bibles to confirmands on the day of their confirmation, but understand these new study Bibles, which are costly, should be used during their study and hopefully used often after their confirmation.
- All members of Trinity are encouraged to volunteer at the Birchwood School. Their Book Buddy program needs readers. Contact Rose Cutsforth at the school for more information.
- Committees of 3 or 4 are visiting local charities to be get a better perspective of what and how they operate. They will report at the November meeting, when our decision on disbursements will be made. A report of one visit to 'Embrace' in Ladysmith appears elsewhere in this November 'Journey.'
- Our November meeting has been changed to November 8th, 10:30 a.m., in the Fellowship Hall. This is an important meeting as our end of the year contributions for local charities will be discussed and decided. All women of Trinity are encouraged to attend this meeting. Be a part of the group, deciding where our hard-earned money should go for the December distribution.

WOMEN OF TRINITY VISIT 'EMBRACE'

The Women of Trinity make their monetary contributions to local charities at the end of each calendar year. In order to be best informed, teams of women are visiting those charities before their November meeting, at which time the teams will report on their visit. Team members Cindy Rubin, Terri Freeman, and Dianne Buxton, visited 'Embrace' in Ladysmith on October 23rd. Embrace was formerly known as TimeOut Abuse Shelter, a safe house for abused women and children. Embrace currently serves three counties; Rusk, Washburn, and Price. In the beginning of 2019, it will be adding Barron County.



Reading a brochure with statistics is one thing, but seeing the facility with its dedicated workers and cheerful rooms is another. But, statistics are important, and stand alone when seeking funding. Besides providing a safe place for those who need it, there are counseling and advocacy contacts for domestic and sexual abuse survivors. They maintain a crisis call line, and work closely with the police and sheriff's departments. A 'safe exchange' room is available for parents who must have supervised visits with their minor -aged children. In 2017, 347 sexual assault survivors came to them for help.

The facility is able to serve 12 guests at a time, using 3 rooms, two bathrooms, and a laundry room. The maximum stay is 30 days. After 30 days, the stay is reviewable. Common areas include a living room, kitchen, and dining area. The facility is staffed 24/7 with trained personnel. It is located in Ladysmith, in a typical nice midwestern neighborhood, with a sign that announces its name, and is heavily secured. There are 13 board of members and 15 staff members. During 2017, 40 volunteers and interns donated 732 hours to help at the shelter. This does not include all the church hours involved in making and preparing items for donations for the shelter. We noticed every bed had a homemade quilt on it. looking very much like the guilts our ladies make at our church. We were told that on intake, every resident chooses their own guilt, and they may take it with them when they leave. Children's guilts are especially important, because they need something of their own to hold on to for security.

The Women of Trinity will make a monetary contribution from the monies they have worked for during the year from an annual rummage sale, bake sales, and serving funeral luncheons. The Missions & Outreach

Committee at Trinity collects items needed by Embrace and delivers it to them. The money from the Women of Trinity would go toward buying necessities not covered or received. The salaries for the employees is covered by federal and state funds along with grants received. We also found other ways we could help by making 'necessity' bags with items such as things for babies, games for kids, etc.

This visit was very informative. We were reminded, as we left, to count our blessings and say a prayer for the blessing that Embrace is to the counties it serves.

MISSIONS & OUTREACH UPDATE

On October 13 quilts and kits were loaded for delivery to Bethany Lutheran Church in Rice Lake. From there these items are sent to Lutheran World Relief in Minneapolis. They are then dispersed to the areas in need.



Items from Trinity were 107 quilts, 23 baby kits, 55 school kits and 18 health kits. Thank you to all who have donated towards these quilts and kits.

Items for Embrace are being collected until after the first Sunday in November. A list of items in need can be located on the table by the Embrace baskets. In Mid-November we will hopefully be receiving Christmas lists from the Birchwood School for Trinity's participation in Adopt-A-Family! On a personal note, this is one of *THE* most awesome things that Missions & Outreach is involved with! There is no way it could be made possible without the extreme generosity of the Trinity family!! Every year God restores my faith in the goodness of others. Even though every year I have doubts worrying down to that last present. What better way to "Live Third?"

A LOOK AT TRINITY'S PAST



(Editor's Note: This is a continuing column focusing on the history of Trinity Lutheran Church. If you have an article to submit, PLEASE send it to Cindy.)

In 1967, nine acres south of highway F were purchased from Engwald Edwardson. A Major fund-raising drive was conducted under the leadership of The Reverend Alan Solomonson. Much discussion, investigation, votes and various inquiries went on until late 1973. Under the leadership of The Reverend Hans Olson, plans were at last found for a modular-type building with a Mansard roof. A congregational meeting was held January 27, 1974. A building project was approved by a vote of 54 to 4. Completion was set for July 1, 1974. The building committee consisted of: Al Haas, Dick Dakins, Everett Dalen, Wally Hesse and Warren Wahlquist. Groundbreaking was held on April 25, 1974 and the building was completed on July 1, 1974. The dedication service and dinner were held n August 4, 1974.

Pastors who served from 1968 to 1978 include 1968-1971 Rev. Richard Lind, 1971-1976 Rev. T. Hans Olson, and 1997- Harlen Menk
