PASTOR JACK'S COLUMN

"Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep His promise. ²⁴ Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. ²⁵ And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of His return is drawing near."

Historians and theologians can't agree on the authorship of the book we call Hebrews, but there is no dispute of its impact in our lives as followers of Jesus. This scripture found In Chapter 10, verses 23-25 offers vital instruction. In it we're reminded of several truths. May they guide us as we transition from an active summer into a peacefilled fall season of ministry.

At least 3 truths are revealed in this passage:

1. God can be trusted to keep his prom-

ise. In our summer study of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount we learned of Gods grand plan for His church and His children. We were assured of His promise of salvation, a secure hope in Christ, and our important role as salt and light in this world today.

2. We are to motivate one another toward acts of love. At Trinity we see members that support and encourage each other. Brothers and sisters willingly serve in every capacity; from offering a shoulder to cry on to picking up a hammer and finishing a construction job, praying for others, teaching the Word, sharing fresh produce, even mowing lawns!

- * One Pencil sharpener
- * Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- * Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- * One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- * One 2 1/2" eraser

A LOOK AT TRINITY'S PAST

[Editor's Note: This is a continuing column focusing on the history of Trinity Lutheran Church. If you have an article to submit, PLEASE send it to Cindy]

1940-1945 - The War Years

In the spring of 1941, the newly remodeled church (located next to the present-day parsonage) was dedicated. In 1942, the congregation voted to change its name to "Trinity Lutheran Church" and voted to join the Norwegian Lutheran Church of America, which in 1960 became part of the American Lutheran Church.

1945-1967 - Years of Growth

At the end of June 1945, Pastor Van Tassel came from Exeland to build up membership, hold Bible classes, and make personal calls. On September 2, 1945, the congregation voted to join in cooperation with his Blue Hills and Exeland Lutheran Churches as on circuit.

In 1946, Trinity Lutheran Church asked to be allowed to join with Long Lake Church as a new parish with one pastor serving both.

In 1947, the church purchased a small parsonage. Student Pastor Arthur Gronberg (yes! Jim Gronberg's father) was the first to move into the parsonage in 1947, and served here with two other students during a three-year period.

On November 6, 1949, Pastor John Ritland was installed to serve the Long Lake and

Trinity parishes. He had previously served as Trinity's pastor from 1912-1918.

Groundbreaking for a new parsonage next to the church took place on September 15, 1950. Completed in 1951, it wasn't until 1952, that a pastor lived in the house – Pastor Robert H. Arneson. It was formally dedicated on July 31, 1955.


