From the Pastor's Desk

"Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows." (Matthew 10: 29-3, ESV)

As many of you know, I worked for many years in a profession in which one witnesses many things which shock the senses. The result of those years in law enforcement is that there are not too many things which shock me anymore. I thought that I had pretty much seen it all, until I witnessed the power of this verse from Matthew firsthand this week.

As Gelene and I were driving South from Birchwood on Highway 48, we were approaching the The Narrows bridge. We could see a fawn in the middle of our lane, running as fast as its little legs could carry it. There was traffic approaching in the opposite direction, so I slowed so as not to startle the little thing into oncoming traffic. The fawn clearly did not know which way to go to escape from that bridge. It went left, then right, then turned in circles. Then, much to our surprise, the fawn jumped over the side of the bridge. That old police instinct to help kicked in, and I stopped to see if I could render any aid. The area where the fawn had jumped was not over the water, but over the rocky embankment.

As I was searching for the fawn, I held little hope that it would be alive, but if it was injured, I would render what aid I could. Very much to my surprise, I found the fawn lying in some brush, quite alert, almost as if it was lying where its mom had left it. The fawn was focused on my every move. As I approached, the fawn sprang to its feet, scampered up the hill, and was gone.

Gelene shouted from the top of hill that the fawn had run into the woods. She had seen no signs of injury: no limp, no obvious broken bones. It was an amazing thing, nothing short of a miracle. The hand of God was clearly upon the little fawn that day.

When you and I are overwhelmed by the pressures of life, we sometime struggle to find the right direction to go for escape. We run to and fro, seeking relief for ourselves while forgetting that God knows what we are going through. He has not lost sight of you. He is with you. The Bible tells us that God will never leave you, reminding you, "*Cast all your anxiety on him* [Jesus] *because he cares for you*" (1 Peter 5:7, NIV). Remember, you have much more value to God than that fawn, or many sparrows.

Letter from Trinity President

The TLC Leadership Team consisting of the Pastors, Council and staff continues to work on reaching out and staying connected to all members of the TLC family. That includes new members, long-time members, inactive members and members who have stopped gathering with us for some unknown reason. The newest initiative created by the joint effort of the Evangelism, Missions and Outreach Teams, Pastors Dan and Barb and the church staff is to contact the inactive members listed on the TLC membership roster. Pastor Barb and Gloria Widiker have been calling those members for whom we have phone contact information. We will be sending out a letter to those that we could not contact by phone. The intent of this exercise is twofold.

1. Update and draft an accurate church roster. This is important for determining if we have a quorum at our annual and special meetings and times when we need to send out congregational letters.

2. Have current contact information for all members so we can stay in touch with them on a regular basis.

These regular contacts would be used to inform members of upcoming TLC events, listen for any needs, concerns, or prayer requests they might have. Just to have a nice visit with them to find out how they are all are doing. We want to let everyone know how much we love and care for our body of Christ. The means to accomplish these regular congregational contacts is being called the Phone Calling Tree.

1st Corinthians 12 tells us that all who believe and are baptized are a part of the body of Christ. God has composed the body that there would be no division, "*but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together*" (vv. 24-26).

Jesus also gave us The Two Great Commandments in Matthew 22:37 -39. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind". This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. "Love is mentioned 714 times in the Bible, yet "giving" or "possessions" is mentioned 2,172 times. This tells us how important giving is to Jesus. In a recent edition of Thrivent magazine, they gave examples how to give to others. How to show our compassion and love for TLC and our neighbors.

Giving of things: monetary support, giving tangible gifts. Hospitality: - open and welcoming or helping people feel accepted without judgement. Giving of self: - give emotional/relational support- being there for someone through compassionate listening, verbal encouragement, and support. Volunteering servicehelping through unpaid labor.

With these things in mind, we will need Phone Tree Callers once we get the tasks listed above completed. Each Phone Tree Caller would be assigned a few TLC members they would call about 4 times a year. The time commitment is small. These nonthreatening calls will be friendly conversations telling members of upcoming TLC events, asking if the member has any need, concern, or prayer request. I know from personal experience that many of you would be great as a Phone Tree caller. You are good at conversing with one another. You have love and compassion for one another, and you put these things into action. In addition, these same skills and passions are needed to give visits to those going through difficult times. The need is great in our aging community, and we need your help. We cannot expect our pastors to meet all the needs of our congregation. In Acts, the Christian Church assigned volunteers to do various tasks in the church to free up the apostles to do the things they were called to do. Contact Pastor Barb or the Church Office if you are feeling led to step out in faith to help with these initiatives.


God of love, you have provided for our every need out of your
