From the Pastor's Desk:

Romans 12:1-2: Therefore, I urge you, brothers, and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing, and perfect will.

Here we are in the Year of Our Lord, 2024. For some of us, our New Year resolutions are already a thing of the past, abandoned because, for us, change is difficult.

A few months ago, I announced my decision to retire from full-time ministry. I have a call in my heart to spend more time with family. This decision will bring about change for Trinity Lutheran Church. Even for the Church, change can be difficult. It is for this reason that I announced my retirement date of May 31, 2025, so far in the future.

You see, the Church as a whole is suffering from a shortage of pastors. The shortage knows no denominational boundaries. The lack of pastors is a problem in every Christian denomination. The reasons for this shortage are varied. The response to the COVID virus has played a huge role in pastors either retiring, or just changing vocations. Workload, hours, pay, impact of ministry on families: these all play a part in the shortage of pastors.

But we need not lament these things, or fret about our future. This is Christ's church, and He has promised that "the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Mt. 16:18.)

Congregations may have to change their expectations of how their pastors will be trained for ministry. They may need to make a choice between a seminary-trained pastor holding a Master of Divinity degree, and a lay person who has chosen another route leading to a certificate allowing them to serve a congregation. Congregations may have to choose between a full-time pastor, or a part-time pastor working alongside lay leadership to fulfill Christ's command to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Mt. 28: 19-20).

Trinity Lutheran will be facing just such a decision in the future. With this in mind, Leadership is putting together a "Roadmap Strategic Planning Team" to help to guide our congregation through the decisions which we will face. I do believe that God has a plan for Trinity Lutheran Church. Please pray for this team! Please make your wishes known to this team! Please support and encourage this team.

"May the peace of God, which surpasses all human understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil. 4:7.)

Letter from Trinity President

In next few weeks, your TLC Roadmap to the Future Planning Team will have its kickoff meeting. The purpose of this team of faithful and dedicated brothers and sisters in Christ is to set some specific goals to better deliver Christ's mission to our world. And our world needs to hear about Christ. Proverbs 15:22 says, "Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers, they succeed." Our greatest advisors are the Holy Spirit and Scriptures. "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps. Proverbs 16:9. So before start setting goals, we need to enlist every one of you to be inspired and committed to pray for this team and God's plan for the future of TLC. "The heartfelt and persistent prayer of a righteous man (believer) can accomplish much [when put into action and made effective by God—it is dynamic and can have tremendous power]. James 5:16.

These prayers are not only for your personal prayer time at home, but also in corporate prayer praying together in worship, in the Wednesday prayer group, in Bible study groups, in women and men's small groups. We need to ask the Holy Spirit's presence to guide us on what TLC should look like in 3 to 5 years in the future but we cannot do it on our own.

Jonathan Graf, President of the Church Prayer Leaders Network, wrote an article entitled *Benefits of Praying Together* in which he lists 3 benefits of corporate prayer.


1. Praying together invites the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

In 2 Chronicles 6-7, we see the dedication of Solomon's Temple. While "the whole assembly of Israel was standing there" (2 Chron. 6:3), Solomon prays a dedicatory prayer in which he invokes the presence of God. "Now, my God, may your eyes be open and your ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place. Now arise, O Lord God, and come to your resting place, you and the ark of your might. May your priests, O Lord God, be clothed with salvation, may your saints rejoice in your goodness" (2 Chron. 6:40-41). Of course the presence of God entered with dynamic power! There is a different atmosphere in churches where people pray together and who have praying people. Worship seems more powerful. There is a sense of connection with God that is not there in non-praying churches. As you pray together as a congregation, God will begin to "show up" more and more.

2. Praying together increases the faith of a congregation to believe God for the miraculous.

Churches that pray together begin to see the miraculous power of

God at work in their midst. It goes beyond what they can and should do into what God wants to do through them. If you increase the level of praying together among your congregation, you will see more miracles happen as your faith rises.



3. Praying together moves people from seeking their own purposes to desiring God's purposes.

Most people's prayers seek the best fix for a situation. We typically pray whatever we are told to pray for a situation, with no real thought of "What does God want to do here?" Something happens to that dynamic, however, when people pray together. They start to let go of their desires to see their purposes fulfilled and start to open themselves up to what God wants. The value of this to a church is huge when it comes to ministry and decision making. If people pray together over an issue, even if people come to prayer thinking they know what the church should do, praying together opens them up to God's desire. People who are disgruntled with decisions a church has made usually have not prayed with the body over that issue. Pray together and watch unity grow.

The Challenge - Jeremiah 29:11-13 is a powerful promise written to a corporate body of people. "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." The "all" there is numeric—God is saying if all of you would seek me, you will find the plans I have for you. If we want to see God's blessing in our churches, if we want to see Jesus' transforming power, the dynamic ministry of the Holy Spirit in our midst, then we need to pray together.

As we all come together in lifting TLC's future to the Lord, we will all have an exciting new faith-building experience as we travel down this road together.


