The JOURNEY — Walking Daily with Jesus

Most of you know that I text my sons, each of them living in different states, daily. This practice was born out of a request from our middle son, August. But, it has been an incredible blessing that's allowed the four of us to remain connected, even at a distance. Scripture is sent daily, as we go through one book in our Bible after another, verse by verse. Also sent are light hearted stories, family news, or moments of mentoring and reminiscing.

Believe it or not, many who are reading this have likely been referenced in one or more of our conversations as well! (Never breaching confidentiality, simply seeking to guide some worthy, young, Christian men in a world that is too often out of control.) Last week I shared a text that was sent from a congregation member to me, asking, "If there was one thing you hoped I had learned under your teaching and preaching, what would it be?"

This was a timely request, as it came a few days after my announcement of accepting a new call. I thought about it for a short time, but soon typed a determined and sincere reply. I imagine those who attend church gatherings regularly or listen online will not be surprised by my answer. I responded:

"The value of Scripture: Truth is found within, cover to cover. It is important to teach this to younger generations, raising them to really know our God and Savior."

I added, "Jesus explains, in Matthew 15:1-9, that true worship of God our Father rises out of a knowledge of scripture."

As I prepare to leave the area, I think of other things I'd hoped to teach, offering final words of guidance. "Keep reading your Bible" would seem to cover it all! I also continue to ask for your prayers in my time of transition. The role I'm stepping into, and the company I'll work with

are truly breaking new ground with their ministry model. It's life as a servant that I haven't seen before, neither have any I've spoken with.

Please pray that I remain faithfully focused on His mission, that I connect the unchurched with believers willing to mentor, that we serve and do all things to the glory of God our Father in Heaven. I'd love to share more with each of you. Our website **FortressProject.org** will soon make our mission and progress very clear. Our Face Book page will be updated regularly too.

I will pray for Trinity during your time of transition. I will pray this church remains faith-filled, Bible preaching, and service orientated. I will pray for your future pastor; that they are a worthy watchman (Ezekiel 33:7-9), prayed for, sincerely loved, and finds their home in Birchwood. I will pray, as we did at our recent council meeting, that there is peace and unity within our congregation. I will pray for the diligence of our new leadership and sincere thanks that I got to be part of this beautiful church.

The text continued: (You had to know there was more!)

In Luke 10:27 Jesus summarized the most important commands in response to the scribe's question, "What must I do to have eternal life?" I've taught this as...

"Live as He lived. Be third."

The only way I can know how Jesus lived is through familiarity with the Bible. Read and do!

President's Message

Things are changing at Trinity Lutheran Church. On January 12th, Pastor Jack told us that he was accepting another call. This announcement came as a surprise to us all. This change is uncomfortable for many of us, but doesn't need to be all negative. Pastor Jack has answered a calling from God to take a new path. Now it is up to us to listen for the new direction God's is calling us to travel.

Isaiah 43:19 promises that as God leads us in a new direction He will provide the path we are to go. "Listen carefully, I am about to do a new thing, Now it will spring forth; Will you not be

aware of it? I will even put a road in the wilderness, Rivers in the desert."

The other thing that has changed was the creation of a new 2020 Council. God has called this group of brothers and sisters "for such a time as this." It is not by chance that each of your Council members answered God's call to serve TLC this year. We have many challenges before us, but at our installation we promised God and you to uphold TLC's Constitution and fulfill our mission statement. In return you, the congregation, promised to support us and come alongside of us in ministry. There is one more crucial part. We all said we will do these things with God's help. How can we go wrong!

The 2020 TLC Council is already working on planning for the future. Lutheran Congregations in Ministry for Christ (LCMC) and Intentional Interim Ministry groups strongly suggests:

- 1. selecting an interim pastor to guide us through this time of transition and change.
- 2. taking time "to engage congregational leadership in weighing mission-critical questions about their own identity, present circumstances and resources, and where God is calling them in the future."

These two verses from Proverbs give us the guidance we need through this time of planning.

The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance and advantage, But everyone who acts in haste comes surely to poverty. Proverbs 21:5

We should make plans—counting on God to direct us. Proverbs 16:9 TLB

When Jesus appeared to the apostles after his resurrection, Jesus told them to wait and stay put in Jerusalem and he would send them the Holy Spirit. During this waiting time the apostles and Christ followers continually met together for prayer. Once the Holy Spirit came upon them at Pentecost the church grew from 120 to over 3000. Today almost one-third of the world's population claims to be Christian. Such is the power of the Holy Spirit that is still with us today. I would suggest we follow the path that the

early Christians took. Continue to meet together and pray until God reveals his plan for TLC to us. Come Holy Spirit.

Pastor Rick Warren, author of *The Purpose-Driven Church*, wrote an article on "How to Wait Expectantly for God to Answer Prayer." He said wait:

- Wait quietly "Let all that I am wait quietly before God, because my hope is in him" (Psalm 62:5 NLT).
- Wait patiently "Be still in the presence of the Lord, and wait patiently for him to act" (Psalm 37:7a NLT).
- Wait expectantly "I wait expectantly, trusting God to help, for he has promised" (Psalm 130:5 TLB).

And this is so important: you must expect to hear from God. There are so many pastors I talk to who do not expect God to give them a dream or an insight. They don't say that specifically, but their behavior and attitude indicate they are no longer waiting on God.

But waiting is the faith factor. We wait expectantly, and waiting on God is never a waste of time. In fact, it's some of the best time you will ever invest in your ministry.

God bless each of you and God bless Trinity Lutheran Church.


ADOPT AN EASTER LILY
