A Letter from Council President

"Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Sound familiar. This phrase is part of The Lord's Prayer that we pray every Sunday if not more frequently. In Matthew 6 we see Jesus using The Lord's Prayer to teach his disciples how to pray.

"One component of Christ's training in prayer involves understanding that God's kingdom has not yet been wholly fulfilled on this earth. Thy kingdom come is not just an expectant yearning for the coming of Christ in the future, even though this longing is contained in the plea. But Thy kingdom come also expresses the prayerful desire of Christ's servants to see God's Kingdom broaden and become increasingly established throughout the world in the here and now." "A Kingdom worker is somebody who takes whatever God gives them – whether that's a talent, whether it's a circle of influence, whether it's a relationship or even an opportunity at work or school – and says, 'How can I use this to advance the message of Christ?'" said Eric Epperson, CIY's senior director of Æffect. "Another question they ask is: 'How can I use this to bring Heaven to earth, and live out King-

dom principles through whatever God has given me?'"

"The Lord has given every single believer a spiritual gift to aid in the work of His kingdom. These aren't natural abilities but instead are the Holy Spirit's power manifested through us—a special enablement that helps us serve according to His plan.

Paul reminds us that we are the Lord's 'workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them' (Eph. 2:10). We should always remember that God's power works through our gifts so there is no reason to shy away from the opportunities He opens up for us, even if they seem daunting.

"Don't spend your life just sitting in a pew! Experience the joy of participating in God's kingdom work. The Holy Spirit will empower you to obey the Lord in whatever He calls you to do.

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common
