Pastor's Corner, July 2023

There is a lot of conversation today about the role of the Church in our world. When I am writing of church, what I am referring to is the Body of Christ, the gathering of those who believe in, and worship, "...Jesus Christ and him crucified" (1 Cor 2:2). The crux of the problem, as I see it, is that much of the church today sees itself as far more holy and righteous than the rest of the world in which we live. We mistakenly speak and portray the lie that says this world would be much more loving and filled with peace if everyone else would just be like us. We say, "Live like us, be like us, worship like us, then there will be peace on earth." We try to ram our self-righteousness down the throat of the world.

The Apostle Paul writes: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves" (Phil 2:3).

I recently read a meditation written by a Lutheran theologian named Chad Bird. It is titled "Vulnerability and the Church," and as I read the words, and as I shared them with the staff at Trinity, each of us was struck by what the church really is. Pastor Bird writes:

" A little bit of vulnerability among Christians would go a long way toward giving a witness to the world about what the church is really here for.

Jesus didn't found a gym where we can go and flex our biblical biceps in front of mirrors so everyone sees how hard we've worked at being holy. He didn't create a virtual spiritual reality where we can gather together with like-minded virtual reality users and talk about things of virtually little importance.

Christ founded a church, which is a little bit hospital, a little bit mental ward and a little bit weekly reunion of sinners who've made a mess of their lives. It's a place where self-proclaimed righteous people who have it all together will be bored because there's nothing for them there. Church is for real sinners who really sin with other real sinners, for here they find the Friend of Sinners, Jesus the Christ." We are sinners in this place called Trinity. But we live under the promises of forgiveness of sin, salvation and eternal life found in Jesus. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast"

(Eph 2: 8,9). We have the good news of Jesus Christ. As Christians, let us gladly share that news with this world. In Jesus' name.

Letter from Trinity President

Recently my mother-in-law had serious respiratory issues, was admitted to the hospital and then to hospice care before passing away. While still at home she talked about her not living too much longer. The Holy Spirit put her situation on my heart. I prayed that He would give me an opportunity to talk to her oneon-one about her faith in Christ's saving power.

Of course, sharing our faith is always a stressful thing to do. I did not want to embarrass her or have this subject affect our relationship. I had a fear of failure and not knowing the right things to say, but I had this sense of urgency to have this discussion. I prayed that God would give me boldness and courage to share God's promises with her.

We were given that time a few weeks later when I could ask her if she believed she was going to Heaven. I shared God's love for her by reading John 3:16 and Psalm 139. Amazingly she was open to having this discussion with me. I sensed she almost expected it. The rest was up to God.

Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 3: 6-7 on this subject. "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow."

It is not our responsibility for spiritual growth. We are only the messengers. Over the next few weeks, I could fall back on my own experiences with my mother's time in palliative care and hospice. I remembered the prayers and Bible verses we read at my mother's bedside. The same prayers and Bible verses were read at my mother-in-law's bedside 15 years later.

God provides all that we need. *"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all*

things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26.

Scary words like evangelism and witnessing are nothing more than sharing God's Word and our own experiences he gives us. Just as we talk to friends and family about things happening in our lives, we should be comfortable talking about Jesus and what amazing love, grace, and peace he has for us. Then sit back and let the Holy Spirit do His work.

The apostle John wrote in 1 John 1 about sharing his experiences he had with Jesus. "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—." Just as John shared his experience with us, let us share what we have heard, seen, and how we have been touched by Jesus.

I have heard it said that we may be the only Bible that some friends, neighbors, and community members will see or hear. Sharing what we have heard through sermons, Bible studies and personal prayer time is an urgent call from Jesus.

The reason I am sharing this very personal time with all of you is the Holy Spirit placed TLC and the Birchwood community on my heart. It is Jesus' desire that all people be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. We have been given the command to go out into the world and make disciples and teach them to observe all the things Jesus has commanded us to do. Please pray


for those in our community who need to hear the Good News of Christ and that the Holy Spirit would show us ways to reach them.

STELLAR VBS was an out-of-this-world cosmic quest full of light years of faith-building fun! There were moments of crazy fun in the Mickey Wey skits, the Closing experiments, and the wonderful songs. And there were incredibly moving times when we saw the Holy Spirit in action as children learned about Jesus' love. So when someone asks if all the work and expense is worth it, the answer is a resounding YES!!

We had 28 participants ranging from PK to grade 5 and over 25 volunteers during our week, June 12-16. During the week, the kids learned about a mission project to send bibles around the world through Operation Kid-to-Kid, a partnership between World Vision and Group Publishing VBS program. A \$12 donation for Operation Kid-to-Kid provides a language-appropriate Bible, plus connects recipients with discipleship opportunities that help them grow in faith. We had an anonymous donor offer to match the kids' donations and between them enough was raised to purchase 28 bibles – one per VBS participant! That sounds like a God Sighting!

And to make it all even more stellar, another anonymous donor purchased a Children's Bible for each of our VBS participants! God is Good!

Many, many, many thanks to all those volunteers, to the Lions Club for their donation, to members of the Trinity Family who donated towards purchasing supplies, to the children for their donations and to the anonymous donors for their generosity.

A very special Thank You to the Decorating Team – Sue and Tom Svitak, Wally Thom, Rob Freeman, Mike Rubin – the décor was incredible! This year's set pieces will be used by First Lutheran Church in Rice Lake when they launch STELLAR VBS, July 30 – Aug 3.
