#### From the Pastor's Desk

Grace and peace to you from God the Father and from our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As I write this message, our congregation has again experienced the passing of another Saint into glory. It is both an honor and a privilege to journey with a family as they go through this time, to share words of hope, and the promise of a resurrection to eternal glory with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

At times, we all struggle with words to share with the family, and the church congregation as we all mourn the death of a brother or sister in Christ. Yet, when we search the scriptures, we find that the Holy Spirit Himself is able to provide the promises which we all seek for comfort.

Just such a promise is found in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, where Paul writes, "But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words." (ESV, emphasis mine)

We do mourn for our loved ones, this is true. But our hope is in Jesus Christ and what He has done on the cross for each of us. For those who believe, even though we mourn, we trust in all of God's promises which have been fulfilled by Christ on His cross. First and foremost, is the promise of Jesus Himself: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved..." (Mark 16:16).

May the peace of God which surpasses all understanding guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.

#### **Letter from Trinity President**

On May 19th and 20th, the TLC Leadership Team had their Annual Workshop. At the workshop, we had a couple of small group brainstorming sessions, discussion groups and team building exercises. As I looked around the room. I saw the Council, the church staff, pastors, several choir members, several Men's group members, several Women's group members, worship assistants, VBS volunteers and Bible study leaders. Do you know what was the common link with these groups? They were all the same people. This small core of people serves on several ministries at TLC. With these brothers and sisters doing much of the ministry at TLC, tiredness and fatigue and the possibility of burnout may occur. Burnout is common in most churches.

In an article entitled *Avoiding Lay Ministry Burnout* found on the Lewis Center for Church Leadership website, Marty Cauley listed three things to help churches avoid burnout.

1. Help church members discover their strengths, their gifts, and their divine calling. Sue Nilson Kibbey, in her book, *Ultimately Responsible*, discusses the importance of helping people live, work, and do ministry utilizing their strengths. You do not burn out doing what you love, only what you loathe. The first step to avoiding the cycle of ministry failure is to help people prayerfully discern their gifts, strengths, and divine calling.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. - 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

The Holy Spirit gives life to the church. Each of us needs to pray that the Holy Spirit will testify to our spirits what spiritual gifts we have that can support the ministries of His church. The last sentence of the 1 Corinthians scripture quoted above says each of us is given gifts to be used for the common good of the church.


2. Encourage people to ask for help. So often pastors and paid staff do not pay enough attention if no one is complaining too loudly and the tasks are getting done. We really need to know if people are happy or

not. Leaders can create an environment where it is safe to ask for help. A leader is "ultimately responsible," as Kibbey writes, for providing assistance, keeping people from getting overloaded with too many jobs, or helping them transition to a new role. Here at TLC, it may be our lay leaders, volunteers and even our pastors who ask for help. My hope is that we answer the call for help from these brothers and sisters when asked.

3. Put time limits on the length of expected service. The "elected until death" expectation common in so many churches is a sure recipe for lay ministry burnout. Create a leadership covenant that allows lay leaders to opt in or opt out annually or at least every two years. While it can be frustrating to see effective people decide to take a breather, it's much better than having them burn out later. Caring for those you expect to care for others is an important pastoral (and leader) responsibility. TLC has been fortunate to have a few new leaders come forward recently to serve on the TLC Council. They have been a great asset to your leadership team. Our Constitution and Bylaws does have term limits for congregational officers. With that in mind the President, Vice President and Secretary terms will end in December. Please prayerfully consider to serve God's church in this capacity. We all are leaders in some capacity or another.

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. *Philippians 2:3-4*
