Jesus prayed, "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me." (John 17: 20, ESV)

On May 14 &15th, your Council and church staff met for the spring retreat. Friday, we spent the evening getting to know each other better and preparing for the Saturday session. Part of that preparation was looking at Revelation 2&3 where Jesus tells each of the seven churches in Asia Minor what he sees as problems with those churches. After this discussion we had a time of personal mediation on if we see anything causing Trinity not following Christ alone and is there anything in our Church causing disunity. After this we had a time of Confession of Sin and Absolution. The evening wrapped up with a time of games and fellowship. The more time I spend with your leadership team, the more I see their passion and love for Christ, for the church and for you. It is a joy just being around these brothers and sisters. On Saturday, we had brainstorming sessions to answer the following questions:

Question #1-How do we effectively reach out to those members who have fallen away from fellowship with Trinity?

To address this question, we started planning for our church family reunion picnic. At this event it is our desire to invite all members on our church roster. This includes current, new and past members that haven't returned to fellowship for a number of reasons. The intent is to celebrate our church's legacy much in the same manner as a family reunion does. In order to undertake this big event, the Christian Life Team created a Picnic Planning Team, consisting of Cheri Anderson, Fellowship and Cindy Rubin, Education, Youth and Family acting as cochairs. Other team members are Diane Hubbard, Mission/Outreach, LeRoy Brensell,

Evangelism and staff members Joann Schilling and Ashley Beffa. All ministry teams will be involved in the picnic preparations.

You may ask what is this Christian Life Team? The Christian Life Team concept allows ministry teams who have upcoming events or activities to enlist the assistance of other ministry teams, staff and volunteers to make sure event goals and timelines are met. This is necessary to make sure all ministry teams work together in meeting the TLC vision statement, To know, love and share Christ.

Question #2 How can we as leaders open doors to the congregation so that we are able to "hear" what their concerns and needs are? How do we make every member feel valued, loved, included, wanted and needed?

As the early church grew rapidly and the Greek followers thought that their widows were being excluded from the distribution of goods. Since the apostles didn't have the time for both spreading the Gospel and handling the distribution of goods, they appointed seven faithful men to take on the distribution of goods. Kind of sounds like ministry teams, doesn't it? TLC's leadership's goal is to follow Jesus' example and be servant leaders and make sure no member feels excluded from anything. We had many great ideas during this brainstorming session. It is good having ideas but we need to bring those ideas into action. A few of these action items we came up with were:

Fellowship and Missions/Outreach are working on events and activities specifically for our "more experienced "church family members.

Establish a phone tree system so we can communicate with our entire congregation.

The Men's Ministry of Trinity are in the discus-

sion on how to best assist with some of the physical needs of our widows, home bound, and elderly.

Look into the Stephens Ministry program to train caregivers to help Congregational Care with their mission. Schedule listening sessions for groups or one on one to hear needs, concerns and ideas from our congregation.

There are many more things we have to work on. We are asking for your help on several fronts. We need to enlist you all as our communication network. We need to hear of any needs of our church and community family. Illness, hospitalization, need of prayer, small household and yard chores, loneliness or depression. We also are in great need of volunteers to help our Fellowship, Evangelism, Stewardship, and Operations (Facilities and Church Grounds) Ministries. You all have skills and talents that God can use for his Church and glory. Good things are happening at Trinity be part of it.

"There may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together." 1 Corinthians 12:25-26 ESV

Closed with prayer.


