The JOURNEY — Walking Daily with Jesus

It's that time again for your TLC Leadership Team (Council and Staff) to start planning its spring retreat where we will set ministry goals and objectives for 2022 and beyond. Many Christian leadership organizations reference the leadership principles of Nehemiah. Nehemiah was the cupbearer/assistant to the Persian King Artaxerxes during the time that some of the Jews were returning to Jerusalem from a 70-year exile. Nehemiah hears that the walls of Jerusalem were still in disrepair from the destruction of the city and of the bitter suffering and hardship of his people. Without having secure gates and walls, the people of Jerusalem didn't have a safe place to live or seek shelter during severe weather. Worst of all, Jews didn't have good place to go when they returned from exile. The self-esteem of Israel was at a low point and people's faith in God was waning. Here is what Nehemiah did and what we can learn from his actions.

Show compassion and empathy for those suffering and in need.

Nehemiah mourned, cried bitterly and showed heartfelt empathy of his countrymen.

Pray for God's vision and guidance on how to help those in need.

Nehemiah immediately spent days fasting and praying that God would show him how to help the people of Jerusalem. He continued praying until he received a vision from God.

Communicate the vision/plan. Nehemiah communicated God's plan to rebuild Jerusalem to the Persian King and the nobles, priests and people of Israel.

Find people and resources that can help you reach your goals.

Nehemiah asked the King for help and Nehemiah was promoted to Governor and given authority to repair the walls. Nehemiah enlisted all peoples and all groups in Jerusalem and surrounding villages to help repair the gates. All people provided labor and resources to help rebuild Jerusalem. Nehemiah managed this big undertaking by delegating smaller easily obtainable tasks.

Assess Needs, then set goals and project timeline


Nehemiah assessed all the gates and walls that needed repair when he arrived in Jerusalem. He determined when and how they should be repaired.

Pray for wisdom, discernment and God's guidance in all circumstances.

Nehemiah in Nehemiah 1 prays a fervent emotional prayer to God. He didn't stop praying once he received God's vision. He asked for discernment and help when confronted by opposition. He prayed for the restoration of spiritual health and practices of the people of Israel when the people were being mocked or opposed in their work. In all Nehemiah prayed 12 times in the Book of Nehemiah.

Practice perseverance and flexibility to change in the face of opposition.

Leaders from surrounding countries that were appointed to be governors of their regions by the Persian King opposed the rebuilding of Jerusalem. These countries were those that God gave to Israel when they came into the Promised Land. Of course, these governors wanted to keep Israel weak and without hope. These governors mocked and said Jerusalem had no hope of rebuilding. They also threatened attacking Jerusalem, conspired to make false accusations about Nehemiah and even conspired to kill him. Nehemiah countered by asking God to thwart their enemies' efforts. He armed half of the workers to be on guard in case of attack. The number one thing Nehemiah did was encourage Israel that with God anything is possible. Nehemiah also met with opposition within Israel. Some people feared the attack from enemies without secure walls and gates. They thought the job was too big to do and lacked the confidence that they could rebuild Jerusalem. Nehemiah kept encouraging the people by telling them rebuilding was God's plan.

Worship, read God's Word and cele-

with Ezra, the priest called the entire assembly together after Jerusalem was restored. Ezra read from the Book of Law of Moses and all were attentive. Ezra blessed the Lord and all people responded with fervent worship and praise. "Then all the people went away to eat and drink, to send portions of food and to celebrate with great joy, because they now understood the words that had been made known to them." Nehemiah 8:12.

"Nehemiah, a rather ordinary person in a servant position, became a transformational leader when apprised of the discontent of the postexilic Jews in Jerusalem and Judah. By praying to God for discernment of His holy will, Nehemiah followed God's calling to rebuild the walls of the city of Jerusalem. In doing so, he enacted various leadership strategies in addition to the one that came most naturally to him as a devout man of faith; namely, prayer to his Maker and Provider". What Made Nehemiah an Effective Leader? The Journal of Applied Christian Leadership

It took all of Israel to come together to realize the vision that God gave to Nehemiah. Last year, your Leadership Team came together to draft God's vision for TLC. "To be a people that know, love and share Christ"

As the Leadership Team plans how to further this vision, we need everyone to pray that God would give us wisdom and discernment and help us bring this vision to fruition. May the God of vision draw us closer to Him, give us a heart for reaching out to people and show us which path to take through prayer and scriptures.

We begin Lent on March 2, at 6:30 pm, with our Ash Wednesday service of communion and the imposition of ashes. Please come join us in the start of our Lenten journey of repentance and renewal.

Lent is a forty-day season of reflection for Christians. The "forty days" correspond symbolically to the forty years Israel journeyed through the desert towards the Promised Land and the forty days Jesus lived alone in the wilderness for a time of fasting and spiritual preparation.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Palm Sunday (also called "Passion" Sunday because it remembers the passio or suffering of Jesus on the cross). Holy Week follows as we walk with Jesus on his journey towards the cross.

The journey ends at sunrise on Easter —the Sunday of the Resurrec*tion* — when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from death and our own resurrection into new lives, new community, new hope through Christ.








