Letter From Trinity President

On Saturday April 15, we watched the live telecast of the memorial and funeral of the two local police officers who were killed in action. Hearing the family and friends of Emily and Hunter talk about their lives I learned several things from both of their lives. Both had Christ in the center of their lives. In both their careers and personal lives, the Bible was their roadmap for their lives. Their love for Christ, their families, coworkers and even those they had to arrest was very evident. The main Bible verse read by several of the memorial speakers was "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:13.

Listen to what Jeffery Curtis Poor says about unconditional love on the rethinknow.org blog. (The mission of Rethink is to help followers of Jesus understand what the Bible says and align their life with God's word.) Throughout the Bible we are shown what perfect love is. While the world cheapens love and only makes it available to those who are worthy, God's love goes far beyond. He raises the bar for what love does and what it requires. What Jesus is saying in this passage is that this kind of love is different than what we can find anywhere else. There is no greater love. The love the world displays is conditional. You have to earn it. And if you screw up it's taken away. But Jesus' love is unconditional. He gives us His love even when we don't deserve it. He loved us while we were still enemies (Romans 5:8). In the first part of John 15:13 Jesus is telling us about the kind of love He has for us and the kind of love we are to have for others. ...Jesus laid down His life for you. Therefore, because of what He has done, you are to go do the same for those around you. That means that you are to die to yourself, your desires, for the benefit of those around you. Rather than fighting for your rights and what you deserve, you lay them down for their benefit. Just as Jesus first did for you. And just imagine the impact the church could make if this is what we did. If we laid down our lifes, our rights, our desires for the sake of others. Rather than fighting for what we deserve, what if we served? Loved? Sacrificed?

If we are to make an impact on our world, our community, our congregation, we must do something different, something new. Isaiah 43:19 says "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" I see and feel a new and exciting movement of the Holy Spirit in our church. Do you feel and see the same thing? Usually, we pray and wait on God to show us His plan for us, but I think God has already shown us through His Word. I feel He is waiting for us to act. James 1:22 (AMP) tells us to prove yourselves doers of the word [actively and continually obeying God's precepts], and not merely listeners [who hear the word but fail to internalize its meaning]. TLC's God - given vision statement is to be a people that know, love, and share Christ." Just as Emily and Hunter jumped into action each time they were called, we should have that same dedication. Do you hear God calling you to do something for Him and His church? There is no greater love than those who work for the needs of their friends. The TLC Leadership Team consisting of Pastors Dan and Barb, the Council, worship and prayer leaders will be meeting on May 19th and 20th to find ways to meet the needs of our congregation, communities, and world. If you know of any spiritual, physical, or emotional need within our congregation or community, we must hear from you. We need you all to be bold enough to tell us of the gaps in our congregational and pastoral care. Also please pray for the Leadership Team during our working sessions. Pray that the Holy Spirit would lead and empower us to fulfill God's present plan for TLC. After the working sessions, we will be looking to all of you to partner with us to deliver His plan for

meeting the needs of all Gods people. "And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within

Mission and Outreach

After being delayed by a snowstorm on St. Patrick's Day, Mission and Outreach was able to bring the kid's quilts, a \$250 check from Mission and Outreach and the wonderful donations from the congregation to Embrace in Ladysmith on March 24. We had a very warm welcome and you would have thought it was Christmas morning due to the excitement of what we were able to bring to them. We have already received a thank you letter from Embrace in appreciation of our gifts.

On April 12, Mission and Outreach met for their meeting. We were able to put together 35 Personal Care Kits which, like the quilts, will go to areas of disaster where people will need them most. The Personal Care Kits will be shipped out in October. We had additional toothbrushes, combs and nail clippers so we are going to try and make more kits through the coming months. During May and June, we will be collecting baby items for Baby Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief and the Pregnancy Center in Rice Lake. We will be collection the following items for each kit:

- + TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®)
- † TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- *TWO receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square*
- + FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- + ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- † TWO pairs of socks
- + ONE hand towel, dark color recommended.
- *TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars*
- *† TWO diaper pins or large safety pins*

Mission and Outreach along with the Women of Trinity will be having a Tea on June 3rd. We are working out details with more information to come soon so save the date.

As always, thank you so much for your donations. We are so excited that we can make a difference in people's lives. We couldn't do any of this without you. Thank you!

CPR/ AED Training

Trinity will be offering a 2 hour class in CPR/ AED training. Training will be provided by certified instructors from Northwoods Technical College in Rice Lake. The training is for adult victims, and will not include training of CPR/ AED for children or infants. All equipment needed for training will be provided by Northwoods Tech. No written tests, hands on instruction only.

The class will be offered on Thursday, May 25th at Trinity. It will run from 6-8PM .

The cost is \$25.00 for those 62 and older, under 62 will be \$32.00. We need at least 8 participants to get the training at this cost. Trinity is able to provide several scholarships.
