I'm sure we could all find a team we could be part of. Everyone has talent and skills that can be used by these teams. Staffing of these teams is critical for us to fulfill our mission and vision. Without your help we might not be able to complete certain things that God wants us to do.

At my previous congregation, when Cyndi and myself went through new members classes, we were given a jigsaw puzzle piece. The point of giving us a puzzle piece was that each member was part of the church and if we were missing the whole puzzle wouldn't be completed. Each of you are a puzzle piece here at TLC. We aren't complete without you.

HAITI'S CHILDREN, INC. FOUNDER PROVIDES UPDATE



Gladys Mungo has been coming to Trinity since 2015. In those 6 years she has only missed 2 times. Once for her own health issues and another because of Covid.

Every visit she has a more dire report of what goes on in Haiti. This year without a doubt has been the most challenging.

The Haitian government has always been shaky and corrupt at best. To make matters worse the Haitian president was assassinated

by Columbian mercenaries. The 26 Columbian are being held in Haiti and Columbia is demanding their return. Unrest has always been the way of life in Haiti.

Roads are being closed until huge ransoms are paid. The last ransom was \$100,000. Roving gangs rule most everything. Ransom was paid and roads were open for a few days and then closed again.

Gladys' workers that are Haitian are managing to keep things going. They fear for her safety if she returns. Kidnapping is always a threat there. She jokes that if she was kidnapped (mostly just because she is American) no one would be able to pay the ransom!

After every one of Gladys' visits, I'm left with a feeling of shock at what goes on in Haiti. But also, how grateful we can be that our lives are not a daily struggle to stay alive or watch our children suffer in any way.

Gladys has taken on the attitude that the future is in the hands of children. Haitian Children Inc (Gladys' organization) "Longs to see the next generation prosper and excel to become leaders in their nation."

The families live in extreme poverty. They live on less than \$3/day. Their homes usually have no electricity or water and they go to bed hungry most nights. That's why the children are fed a healthy, nutritious meal every school day.

Sponsorship includes tuition to attend school, provide school supplies, school books and supply a hot meal.

This year there was a need for black dress shoes which are needed to complete their school uniform. Gladys left Trinity this year with 30 pairs of assorted black shoes!

The collection jar that sat on the table with the shoes during Fall Fest made \$85 to go towards shipping!

The best gift that can be given to Gladys and Haiti Children Inc is PRAYERS! Continue to raise up Gladys and all of Haiti in your prayers!!

A phrase that is often repeated is "Thank you for the assistance needed to grow and develop into the person God intended me to be."

Trinity Lutheran Church August Treasurer's Report Summarv

August 2021 results were satisfactory. Income was up from July and more than the average budgeted monthly amount, while expenses were higher than planned. We brought in \$58.50 more than we spent.

Income for August, 2021 was over plan at about \$15,800, against our plan of \$14,700. Expenses for the month were over plan at about \$15,800 versus a monthly plan of \$14,700.

This was partially driven by the repair and replacement of computers.

For the year, TLC has brought in about \$5,400 more than has been spent. Thanks again to all members for their continued generosity in 2021.
