From the Pastor's Desk

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. <u>And the peace of God, which surpasses all under-</u><u>standing, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.</u> (Philippians 4:6-7, ESV) Greetings in Christ Jesus.

This past week Gelene and I had yet another deer encounter on Highway 48. Unfortunately, the deer, a young buck, did not fare as well as the fawn in our first encounter. The story goes like this: Gelene was driving and had just turned onto Highway 48. It was late in the evening, and it was raining. Before she had reached highway speed, several deer appeared from the shadows of the ditch to our right, running at full speed to cross the road. Even though Gelene tried to avoid the deer, this young buck, the leader of the pack, struck the passenger side of our car. While Gelene and I were uninjured, the buck did not survive. The car did not fair well either. This incident fits into the definition of "a bad day."

Now we enter the struggles that so many people in our area encounter as we work with the insurance adjusters, the claim representatives, and the auto repair people to get the car repaired. There are too few auto body repair shops in our area, and our insurance company has us driving to Eau Claire for the repairs. However, all of the above-mentioned people have been very helpful and polite to us during this process. But still, the claim process can get frustrating, can't it? The process can induce anxiety as we wonder; "How much is this encounter going to cost us?" For the many among us who have had similar things happen to them, we can easily understand the aggravation which can so easily arise in the lives of people, even Christians. And while the process of getting a car repaired can seem daunting at times, the anxiety it produces pales in comparison with the issues which so many of us face daily: addictions, illnesses, financial shortfalls, loneliness, and family concerns of all sorts. We can ask ourselves if God even cares about what we are going through.

The apostle Paul understood trials and tribulations. By the time he wrote the letter to the Philippians, Paul had been through more than his fair share of bad days. He was in prison for his faith. It is quite possible that this letter was written by Paul during his final imprisonment before his death. Despite all of his trials, though, he was able to write this letter, which is a note of encouragement. Paul encourages the church to stand faithful in their love and service to Christ, finding the source of their true joy and contentment in Christ alone.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Here you will find the key to real contentment: taking everything before the Lord in prayer, trusting that He alone will walk with you, and will answer your every prayer according to His perfect will. Most importantly, you have the promise that as you take your every need before our Heavenly Father, against all human reasoning and understanding, "... the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

As you go through trials today, I pray that you will feel free to take them to the Lord in prayer and find the peace that is there 'for you', found only in the cross of Jesus. Amen. P.D.

Letter from Trinity President

"A couple months ago, I presented a devotion to the Council entitled "God Instills Leadership". It was a devotion I found on the Lutheran Hour Ministry website that was published on Dec. 7, 2004. At that meeting, the Council discussed the need to build up and mentor new leaders here at TLC. New leaders under the Holy Spirit's inspiration bring added energy and new ideas to help promote Christ in our communities and lead TLC into the future. It also gives the present leaders a time of rest and the opportunity to move into new directions. In the devotion, the author asks the questions, are you a leader or a follower or both? And what is preventing you from being a leader?

This is part of the devotion, "David also said to Solomon his son, "Be strong and courageous, and do the work. Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the LORD God, my God, is with you. He will not fail you or forsake you...."1 Chronicles 28:20.

After all, look who God used: Moses said, *"Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"* (Exodus 3:11). Young Joshua led God's people to the Promised Land. Solomon inspired God's people to build the temple. And God uses you and me to lead His people in the faith. No doubt it's a daunting task, but we are not alone in what we do. When our Lord, in His boldness, instills and blesses our leadership, great and wonderful things happen to His glory.

Where is your Advent heart calling you to serve? Pastor Bonnie Sala on Guidelines.org wrote an article named "A Call to Reluc-
